- 1. Call to Order: Called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Sheila.

5. Reports:

- a) Administrator's Report:
 - i. Achievement Test Results

The data from the achievement tests was used to create the results review and the goals for the current year. The overall trend at OES is that the students meeting the acceptable standard is on par with the province but the students achieving the level of excellence is below the province.

ii. Results Review

The entire results review is available from Lynn Shabada upon request.

Every year, time is spent looking at the results of the Provincial Achievement Tests, the Satisfaction Surveys and the Accountability Pillar. All of the data is pulled together to see how it is affecting student learning and then professional development is designed to meet the needs of students. Administration goes before the school board to present the results review. The School Improvement Plan is available on the website.

School Improvement Plan

Goal: Through differentiated instructions, the diverse needs of students are met resulting in authentic engagement.

Strategies:

- -lead assessment/planning review meetings for grade level teams once per term
- -lead collaborative response meetings three times per year
- -analyze grade level data once per team
- -program for literacy supports: leveled literacy intervention teacher, phonemic groups (gr. 1 and 2), Language and Literacy Enrichment Program (K-2)

-design a strategic professional development plan: grade level and teacher meetings, book study, tech talks, and PD days align to support teacher efficacy in differentiating instruction for all learners

-Dare to Care program

-take the time day (gr. 5-7)

Desired Outcome

-effective learning and teaching within caring, respectful, safe and healthy environments

iii. Indicators of Achievement

The indicators of achievement provided on the report card were reviewed and modified to provide a clearer description of student achievement. Also, 'IN' was added as a descriptor to indicate that insufficient data has been collected to report a mark.

iv. Council of School Councils (COSC)

Members of School Councils from across the division met on October 29 in Whitecourt. In the morning, Alberta School Councils gave a presentation about engaging your School Council. In the afternoon, participants shared ideas and discussed forming a Council of School Councils where all of the councils would have the opportunity to come together. Some different ideas about how often the COSC would meet were discussed.

v. East End School Configuration

The school division is considering a grade reconfiguration for the schools on the east end of Northern Gateway. The proposal is that Rich Valley, Onoway Elementary, Darwell and Grasmere will all become K-7 schools and Onoway High School will remain a grade 8-12 school. There will be a public meeting on Thursday, December 3 at OHS and all parents are encouraged to attend. A final decision will be made in February after all of the input has been gathered and synthesized.

vi. Communication With Parents

Onoway Elementary is expanding its methods of communication with parents including a recently launched Facebook page and Remind texts. To sign up for Remind texts, please subscribe by following the instructions on the school website. Some teachers are also using E-teacher to communicate with parents and provide information regarding homework assignments.

vii. Staffing

Miss Modien's FTE has been increased and she will work in grades 2-3 to assist with numeracy one day a week.
